A NOTE FROM OUR DALLAS TOWNSHIP POLICE CHIEF

During this time of year, it is important to refresh our safety skills and skills on protecting our property. I'm sure by now everyone knows what a porch pirate is. A porch pirate is someone who steals packages off the porch of your home. "PORCH PRIATES" are active all year long but especially this time of year as more people use on-line shopping. To reduce your chances of becoming a victim here are some tips.

1. Install a security camera on your house. Doorbell cameras with voice capabilities are a wonderful tool.

2. Purchase a security box. This box can be secured to your porch and the delivery person can place the package in the box the lock the box.

3. There are Porch Pirate Bags which are attached to your door with a cable and lock. Again, the delivery person places the package in the bag, closes the bag and locks the lock.

4. Have the package delivered to someone you trust and know is going to be home, such as a relative or neighbor.

5. Generally, UPS, FedEx and the United States Postal Service drive down your street about the same time every day. You should learn these times so if you are home you can start watching for the delivery. Yes, packages get taken even if you're home.

These are only a few suggestions for you to think about. There are many options to protect your property and we highly suggest it.
