27th. Residents will be
permitted to drop off leaves,
grass clippings, and brush.

Spring Clean Up fees:

- Mattresses and box springs - \$5.00.
- Bulky items such as large furniture, stuffed chairs, couches, and rugs - \$5.00.
- Tires - 4 per family - \$2.00 per tire.
- Car loads per family is unlimited. Pick Up truck loads and trailers 2 loads per family no charge. After 2 loads Trucks and trailers with 6ft. box are \$15.00 per load.
- Trucks and trailers with 8ft. box are \$20.00 per load.
- Large cargo vans and box trucks will be charged accordingly.

The following items will not be accepted for disposal under any circumstances: freezers, refrigerators, dehumidifiers, television sets, air conditioners, hazardous wastes, chemicals, brush, tree stumps, cinder blocks, animal or human waste, shingles, sheet rock, or other building materials, leaves, grass, garbage, or newspapers. There will not be any electronic equipment recycling.

DALLAS TOWNSHIP ROAD DEPARTMENT NEWS

Eddinger Road was put out for bid to complete contracted milling and paving. Bids were opened at the May 13th Supervisors meeting. New Enterprise Stone and Lime was the lowest bidder and bid price is \$202,997.00. Eddinger Road will be resurfaced from the Lower Demunds intersection to the Franklin Township Line. Work will start this summer!

The Supervisors approved for a second round of streets to be milled and paved in the June meeting. Advertisements for bids will be going out for Harris Street from the intersection of Saddle Ridge Drive to Lincoln Street, and Lincoln Street. Sealed bids will be opened during the July 7th Supervisors meeting and work will start this summer.

SOUTHSIDE PARK UPDATE

Advertisements for bids are out for the nature playground and MS4 stormwater improvements. Sealed bids will be opened during the July 7th Supervisors meeting. Construction is anticipated to begin in early August.

Dirt Bikes and ATV Safety

Residents are reminded that riding Dirt Bikes and ATV's on township roadways are prohibited. The Dallas Township Police intend to strictly enforce these laws this summer. There have many complaints from the Orchard View Terrace and New Goss Manor Development of riders riding on the roadway.

Grass Clippings

Keep your grass clippings off the roadway, blowing your grass clippings on the roadway creates a hazard for motorcyclist and bicyclists. The clippings create a slippery condition and may cause a motorcycle or a bike to lose traction and crash.
