### DAMA STORMWATER PROGRAM



The Dallas Area Municipal Authority has partnered with Dallas Borough, Dallas Township, and Kingston Township to administer their Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) programs.

The MS4 program was instituted to reduce pollution entering our local waterways, which eventually make their way into the Susquehanna River and ultimately into the Chesapeake Bay. Are you familiar with MS4? If not, MS4 is a municipal separate storm sewer system. MS4 refers to the network of pipes, storm drains, and channels, within a community that collects and conveys stormwater to a local water source.

The Unites States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) instituted this program in response to severe pollution issues in the Chesapeake Bay. The pollutants of most concern are nutrients (nitrogen and phosphorus) and sediment that get carried to the Bay from streams within the Chesapeake Bay Watershed.

A DAMA storm water coordinator will soon be providing storm water education to local residents. The DAMA Fund provided a storm water improvement project at the upcoming Southside Park and the new salt shed in the township.
