Dallas Township Ranks 13th Safest Place to live in Pennsylvania

"A true community is not about being geographically close to someone, it's about being connected and responsible for what happens. Humanity is our ultimate community." Dallas Township was recently listed as the 13th safest place to live by SafeWise, an independent review site using the FBI's 2019 Uniform Crime Report combined with population statistics. The study was based on violent crime and property crime per 1,000 residents.

Did you know that Dallas Township was formed in 1817 from territory taken from Kingston Township, and it was named for Alexander J. Dallas? Alexander J. Dallas was the 6th United States Secretary of the Treasury and also the father of George M. Dallas, the Vice President of James K. Polk.
