## **Dallas Township Dedicates Salt Shed**



Dallas Township Supervisors recently dedicated the new salt shed to retired Township Supervisor, Frank Wagner. Frank served as a Supervisor for 50 years. Township Supervisors were proud to dedicate the building to someone who made such an impact in our local community. Dallas Township received a DCED/LSA Grant to fund the project. The total cost of the site was \$385,441.61 and the grant was given in the amount of \$310,000.

The salt shed now meets the needs of winter maintenance for stock piling salt versus waiting for deliveries. Design, engineering and project management was provided by Douglas Trumbower and Associates Inc. The site contractor was Machiesky Construction, the building contractor for the project was Dutchman LLC, and the Electrical contractor was Delta Electrical.

DAMA was also able to incorporate an MS4 Stormwater project at the site. The township thanks everyone involved for their hard work andefficient timeline. The previous shed held 100 tons of salt and this new shed holds approximately 1,000 tons. The event was attended by Senator Lisa Baker and PA State Representative, Karen Boback as well as the Township Road Department and Township Supervisors and Management Staff.
