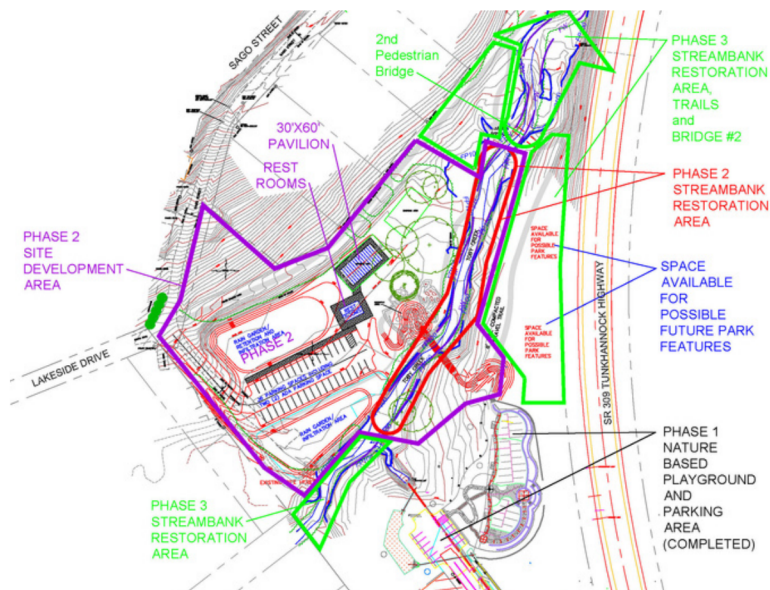

PHASE 2 AT THE DALLAS TOWNSHIP PARK

The Dallas Township Board of Supervisors is pleased to announce the ongoing development of Phase 2 of the Dallas Township Park. At a recent town hall meeting held on April 20, 2023, the board met with local residents to discuss the community's vision for the space and presented a proposed design plan. The board received valuable feedback from those in attendance.

The original plan for Phase 2 featured an additional 50 parking spaces, including 3 ADA compliant. The revised plan now includes 36 spaces with 2 ADA compliant. Additionally, the pavilion's original size of 100ft x 50ft has been reduced to 30ft x 60ft, providing more space for greenery and trees. The project will also include the installation of restrooms.

The plan includes the incorporation of two rain gardens, the installation of walking bridge #1, the restoration of old trails, and the creation of new trails. Additionally, stream bank restoration along Toby's Creek will also be included.

The supervisors are working to finalize the plans soon and anticipate on releasing them for bidding in the fall of 2023. The Dallas Township Board of Supervisors is excited to provide an even better community space for the residents.

Help Us Help You - The Importance of House Address Numbers



House numbers do more than just label addresses – they're a critical tool for emergency responders to locate people who need help. Quick responses are crucial in these situations, so it's essential that fire, ambulance, and police personnel can quickly and accurately identify the address. Under the newly adopted Property Maintenance Code, all buildings are required to display approved address numbers in a position that is easily legible and visible from the road or street where the property is located. When choosing your address numbers, use Arabic numerals or alphabet letters that are a minimum of 4 inches in height with a stroke width of at least 0.5 inches. Script numbers or numbers that are spelled out in words may be aesthetically pleasing but are difficult to read quickly from the street. Choose numbers that contrast well with the background and are easy to read. Be mindful of any obstructions such as shrubs, trees, flags, or decorations that may hinder the view of your house numbers. Ensure numbers are visible from both sides of the house and can be clearly seen when approaching. If the building is situated far from the main road, ensure the numbers are prominently displayed at the beginning of the driveway.
