Get Ready for Dallas Township's Annual Spring Clean-Up Event



As the warmer weather approaches, Dallas Township is excited to announce its much-anticipated annual Spring Clean-Up event. However, due to budget constraints, this year's event will be shortened to three days.

Mark your calendars for Thursday, May 2 through Saturday, May 4, 2024. Residents can bring items they wish to dispose of to the Dallas Township Road Department, behind the Dallas Township Police Department building, conveniently located at 2919 SR 309 Highway, Dallas, PA. Operating hours for drop-off will be from 8 am until 6 pm on Thursday and Friday, and from 8 am until 4 pm on Saturday. The Township's Road Department will be on hand to assist in emptying vehicles, ensuring a smooth and efficient process for all participants.

Proof of residency will be required at the time of drop-off. Additionally, residents utilizing pick-up trucks and trailers will be charged accordingly, depending on the amount and size of items brought. Fees will apply for bulk items such as carpets, overstuffed chairs, couches, dressers, and mattresses. Fees will be determined once a bid proposal has been awarded.

Certain items will not be accepted for disposal under any circumstances. These items include freezers, refrigerators, television sets, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, hazardous wastes, chemicals, brush, tree stumps, cinder blocks, animal or human waste, shingles, sheetrock, or other building materials, as well as leaves, grass, garbage, or newspapers. Please note that electronic equipment recycling will not be available during this event.

In preparation for Spring Clean-Up, the Dallas Township Board of Supervisors is currently accepting sealed bid dumpster proposals until noon on Tuesday, April 2, 2024. Repairs planned for Goodman Road and Dorchester Drive

The engineers of Dallas Township are presently focusing on defining the scope of repair projects for both Goodman Road and Dorchester Drive, which were affected by the flooding on September 9, 2023. Having completed the surveys, the Township has obtained approval from the Supervisors to begin advertising bids. Additionally, the Luzerne Conservation District has conducted a stream bank survey to assist in determining the appropriate pipe size for the Goodman Road crossing. There is potential for rebuilding Goodman Road in the future as the Township plans to apply for grant funding through the Dirt, Gravel, and Low Volume Road Maintenance Program.
