What You Need To Know About Stormwater Pollution



Remember - Everyone Lives Downstream

What is Storm Water Runoff?

This stormwater runoff will eventually make its way into our streams, rivers, lakes, and ponds. The pollutants it picks up as it flows over impervious areas negatively impact how we can use that water for purposes such as drinking, cooking, bathing, and recreation.

Why is Storm Water Runoff a Problem?

As stormwater runoff flows over impervious areas such as streets and parking lots, it collects pollutants such as oil, sediments, trash, and other debris. This stormwater will eventually make its way into our streams, rivers, lakes, and ponds. This water we use for various purposes such as drinking, cooking, bathing, and recreation.

What You Can Do!

Some Simple Ways You Can Help Reduce Stormwater Pollution Maintain Your Vehicle

- ✔ Check your vehicle for oil leaks and drips regularly
- ✔ Recycle used motor oil properly
- ✔ Never dump oil and other vehicle fluids down storm drains, catch basins, or onto the ground.

Lawn and Garden Care

- ✔ Use fertilizer sparingly
- ✔ Consider using organic fertilizer and slow-release varieties
- ✔ Keep fertilizer off paved areas
- ✔ Don't overwater your lawn
- ✔ Clean up after your pets
- ✔ Apply herbicides sparingly and follow the instructions in the label

DID YOU KNOW ?

Sediment is the #1 source of pollution in our waterways!!!



The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection labeled approximately 28,000 miles of rivers and streams to have impaired water quality.

This makes these waterways unsafe for drinking water, aquatic life, recreation, and fish

consumption. *High amounts of sediment in stormwater is the leading contributor of waterway impairment.
